

Have your sh*t together! Are you clear on the role you want? The location you want to travel to? The salary you want?		Avoid calls / emails / any form of communication from recruiters or employers If you don't want the job it's polite to reply to advise so and give a brief reason why	
Make sure you keep a track of the companies are applying for – grab a note pad OR add the info to excel. Add the company name, the date you applied, the role and a notes section if you want to add anything else		Answer a call from a recruiter or an employer with the following "I've applied for soooooo many roles, what job are you calling about?!" This says to the caller, you've just sent your CV anywhere and everywhere in the hope something sticks It also adds time to the call which recruiters don't have as they have to replay the information to you again	
 Make sure your CV is a clear 2-page document showcasing yourself and your skill set, and ensure it is tailored to the role you are applying for We have the following available for you to use CV Template How to write a CV How to tailor a CV How to write a cover letter 		Don't send your CV off to a sh*t tonne of Recruitment Agencies without doing research – it's like throwing your CV into a black hole	
Contact an employer with the following I can see you are looking for a (job title), I don't have the relevant skills and experience, but I would love an opportunity to apply for something within my skill set. Please bear me in mind for future opportunities		Don't tick yes to screening questions on a job board in the hope you will get through the application process. Those questions are there for a reason You are ultimately wasting employers time and setting yourself up for a rejection email	

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Send the recruiter or the employer a polite email if you didn't get the job, you don't want to burn bridges. "Thank you for considering me for the role, if anything else comes up in your organisation then please do consider me"		Get disheartened if you don't get the job, you were looking for There will be others, I can promise you that	
Put yourself out there on social media Facebook has jobs pages that are specific to your local area – why not try posting 'I am looking for work in (sector) and in the (geographical) area You can also do this on LinkedIn		Don't just reply on job sites, they are great and serve a purpose but there are lots of other sites you can find work on If you find companies in your area and check out their social media pages I can guarantee you will find some hidden gems in there!	
Grow your network Add yourself to job groups on Facebook Add people that are in your local area in the companies you want to work in on LinkedIn If you are interested in networking, then this could also be beneficial (you can find groups for local networking all over social media)		Don't sit at home relying on job sites and applying for 1 job a day Unfortunately, it's a numbers game with applying for roles The more roles you apply for the higher chance you have of achieving success	
Use the ' Job Search Calendar' we have to help you be creative when looking for work It'll help you be consistent, and every day will be something different		Don't give up! We have all the right tools, hints & tips for you to take back control of recruitment and get you back into work!
